

Music Policy

At Tarvin Primary School, our music curriculum aims to help children feel they are musical and develop a life-long love of music. Music is the universal language where we aim to enthuse a passion for music by making it fun, creative but also developing literacy and language skills with the goal of encouraging a child to engage in music the whole lives. We focus on developing the skills, knowledge and understanding that children need to become confident performers, composers, and listeners such as self-esteem, confidence, teamwork, resilience and perseverance. Our curriculum introduces children to music from all around the world and across generations, teaching children to respect and appreciate the music of all traditions and communities.

The music curriculum at Tarvin is underpinned by Charanga. This supports teacher knowledge and understanding when delivering the key concepts of the music curriculum as well as drawing on support from the Music Hub/edsential to provide whole class instrumental tuition – ukulele, Y4.

Music is taught from EYFS to Year 6 and is built around a spiral progression to ensure skills are revisited and built upon each year. Untuned percussion and tuned percussion are used in key stage 1 from table tapping to tambourines, performance is included in most lessons. Moving into key stage 2 we provide a wide and varied musical opportunity for ALL children including free music instrumental lessons (taught in whole classes) in Year 4 with Ukulele. In addition, there are opportunities for small group or individula instrumental lessons in a range of instruments in school thorogh the Music For Life charity.

We have the 'Tarvin Choir' club which performs in public and in the Young Voices concerts. The Choir also practices leading up to Christmas the Christmas performance at the carol concert

Curriculum aims

- To develop musical skills and concepts through listening, appraising, performing, and composing.
- To develop social skills through co-operation with others in the shared experience of music making.
- To develop an understanding of musical traditions and developments in a variety of cultures.
- All learning experiences are rich in musical language.
